DROPOUT PREVENTION & RE-ENGAGEMENT

PSESD OPEN DOORS PROGRAM

Designed for disconnected youth ages 16-21, off-track for high school graduation



The DOR Reengagement program serves justice-involved /out-of-school youth interested in earning high school credits and a diploma. PSESD Open Doors Program is a free to attend, designed to help students who have either dropped out or aren't attending school, get re-involved and receive their high school diploma.

Services will address academic and non-academic barriers to graduation. A case manager meets with each student monthly or more often to assess program progress, to evaluate progress toward coursework completion, and to mitigate barriers.

Eligibility Requirements(in accordance with WAC):

- Between 16-21 years old
- Haven't met high school graduation requirements
- Are credit deficient (not on track to graduate by age 21) or have a referral from an approved education advocacy service

Case management services support all students in areas including, but not limited to:

- academic advising
- employment assistance
- career guidance
- referrals
